
Amtrak's Pennsylvania Vision: Build on Success, Create New Connections



Enhance Successful Existing Service


- → Keystone: Harrisburg Philadelphia New York
 - 12 daily round trips today
 - Increase speed to 125 mph for entire route
 - 2:54 trip time vs. 4:00 peak driving time
- → *Pennsylvanian:* Pittsburgh Philadelphia New York
 - Increase to 2 daily round trips, up from 1 today
 - 6:58 trip time (PGH-PHL) vs. 6:10 peak driving time

Economic and Mobility Impacts

- → Over 400,000 new riders annually in addition to typical ridership of 1.8 million for the two services
- \rightarrow \$276 million in incremental annual economic impact
- → **\$4 billion** in incremental economic activity from capital investments based on \$1.6 billion projected total capital investment necessary



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New Connections

- → Scranton New York:
 - 3 daily round trips
 - 3:25 trip time vs. 3:10 peak driving time
- → Allentown New York:
 - 2 daily round trips
 - 2:15 trip time vs. 2:30 peak driving time
- → Reading Philadelphia New York:
 - 3 daily round trips
 - 2:55 trip time vs. 3:20 peak driving time

Economic and Mobility Impacts

- → **1.3 million riders** annually in the aggregate for the three new routes
- → **\$200 million** in annual economic impact
- → \$6 billion in economic activity from capital investments

based on \$2.7 billion projected total capital investment necessary

→ 3 years estimated minimum time to start service
